The position of Family Well-Being Worker will be directly responsible to the Executive Director in providing support to all resident living in the community of Shawanaga First Nation (as well as after-hours during crisis situations/on call).

ROLE & RESPONSIBILITIES:

- To work as part of the Shawanaga Healing Centre team providing quality experiences for Families and Children/Youths/Young Adults/Adults/Elders.
- To support family's well-being and working in partnership with Family & Child Coordinator, other professionals, members of local voluntary, and community groups.
- To undertake whole family/ holistic assessments and co-design Health and Well-Being Plans with service users, identifying support needs to ensure maximum engagement in improving their health and well-being.
- To work directly with families in need to promote, strengthen and to develop the potential of parents and children and empower them prevent children becoming looked after and/or suffering significant harm.
- To attend all training sessions and program supervision meetings attached to your project.
- To use case management and write case notes after each session with a client using the forms provided and keep records of your work.
- Maintain personal and professional development to meet the changing demands of the job and ensure that service users are as fully involved as possible in decisions, which affect them individually.
- To adhere to confidentiality, information sharing protocols and provide monitoring information as required.
- To undertake any other duties as required by Manager.
- Flexibility to work off normal hours (on-call) to accommodate respected targets groups, as required.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Degree level education in the field of Social Services, Mental Health, or PSW Certified, or equivalent with combination of work experience.
