**June 5, 2017 to August 25, 2017 (12 weeks)**

<b>Program Overview</b>	
12 weeks (June 5 to August 25, 2017))	Preparatory Component includes IPS100-Culture and Heritage, 42 hrs. accredited course as well as career enhancements- 1 week block plus one day a week for duration of program-Strong Interest Inventory, Individual Learning Plan, Industry tours, etc.
	Health/Safety Training 1 week
	Plumbing Trade Exposure- 10 days
	Building Construction Trade Exposure – 10 days
	Carpentry Trade Exposure – 10 days
	Electrical Trade Exposure- 10 Days
Ongoing (Sept. 2017 to August 2018)	Provide individual support, referral and ongoing guidance in pursuit of pathway options.

### **Additional Information**

#### **Program Fees**

There is **no cost** to participants for tuition and other program costs including: Health and safety training fees, personal protective equipment- e.g.: safety boots, safety goggles, knee pads, and a North Bay City Transit pass or a parking pass.

#### **Students from out of town:**

**Travel Expenses:** Any travel to North Bay and back to home community must covered by the applicant or sponsor including taxis upon arrival and return to bus station and/or train station.

**Living Expenses:** You must secure your own funding for your living expenses. You can either stay with relatives or other private accommodations or you access our Canadore Residence. If you require childcare, you must ensure your funder provides childcare expenses as well. Unfortunately, there are no child-care services on campus so the participant must find their own child-care provider.

**Residence Accommodations:** Residence requires a “sponsorship letter” from your funder. All sponsorship letters must be received one week prior to program start up.

## Aboriginal Women in Trades Program Overview For Applicants

### Canadore Living/Residence Rates-

Single Rate: \$150.00 per person per week or \$1,800.00 for 12 weeks

Family Rate: \$1200 per month x 3 months = \$3,600.00

- Rate Includes: Continental Breakfast daily
- Linen Set (Sheets, Towels, Face Clothes, Pillows)
- Set of Pots/Pans for the Unit (Sauce Pan, Frying Pan, Boiling Pot)
- Set of Plates for each person (Plate, Mug, Glass, Knife, Spoon, Fork)
- A weekly linen change will take place on Tuesday of every week, as well as a weekly cleaning of the bathroom/kitchen/living space of each unit.

### Entrance Requirements:

- Applicant must be over the age of 19 years and out of school for more than one year.
- Applicants must have a desire to explore or work in the trade program areas in the future.
- Applicants may or may not have a secondary school diploma.

### Program Completion:

Participants must successfully complete all components in the program to be eligible for the Aboriginal Women in Trades Certificate of Completion.
