NATURE AND SCOPE OF POSITION:

With the growth of Wahnapiatae First Nation Community, the need for a full time Community Health Nurse has become apparent. The Norman Recollet Health Centre of Wahnapiatae First Nation is pleased to announce that we are currently recruiting for the position of a Community Health Nurse.

This is a full-time permanent position (pending funding) for an experienced RPN or RN who will report to the Clinical Supervisor. They will work with partnerships with health service providers, developing and implementing prevention and awareness programs within the community, as well as supporting clients.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Must be a Registered Practical Nurse or Registered Nurse in good standing with the College of Nurses
- Must be a member of the Registered Practical Nurse or Registered Nurses Association of Ontario
- Minimum of 2 years clinical experience in nursing
- Experience working in a First Nation Community is an asset
- Current CPR, AED and First Aid course or willingness to obtain
- Excellent computer skills, ability to use a medical EMR system
- Excellent interpersonal and communication skills approach with clients in a clinical setting
- Valid driver's license and must have a reliable vehicle
- Negative vulnerable sector criminal record check

SPECIFIC RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Collaborates with the HBHC Worker to provide pre-and post-natal care, teaches prenatal classes, visits homes, and makes referrals. Conducts child health clinics.
- Provides an immunization program as per the Ontario Ministry of Health and ISC Guidelines
- Collect blood samples and label all samples as outlined in policies and procedures
- Conducts clinics and home visits to follow-up clients with communicable diseases and their contacts
- Teaches health education designed to meet the needs of the community

- Develops and implements health education programs directed to individuals and groups in the community based on their health needs
- Develop and support telemedicine events and clinical consultations
- Provide the clinical support needed to clients while attending sessional or group programs
- Maintain documentation: Record keeping of telemedicine events/consultation and communication of referral forms in preparation to follow ups and statistical reporting
- Promote Telemedicine to healthcare professionals, clients and the community
- Maintain and follow the obligations with respect to Personal Health Information
