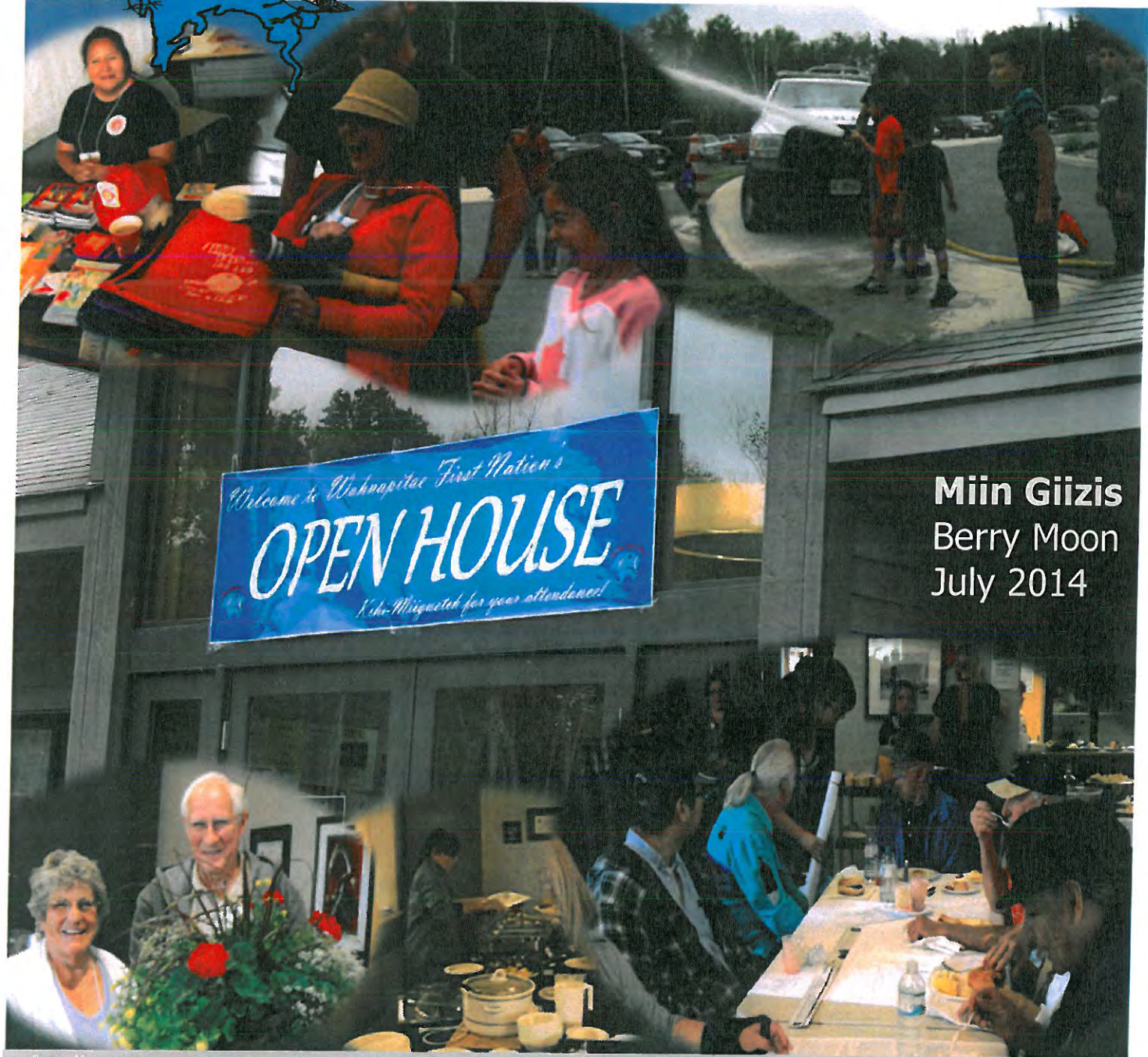

A Land Mark Case: Supreme Court Expands Land -Title Rights in Unanimous Ruling

Hi All

In the decision yesterday of the Supreme Court of Canada, where all 8 judges ruled in favour of the Tsilhqot'in Nation, in *Tsilhqot'in Nation v. British Columbia*, June 26th 2014, where there are no Treaties, resource companies must seek consent of the First Nation, where community use and occupation are known to exist, for resource development projects. This case confirmed Aboriginal title for this group based on records of use, occupation and affinity and that the land had never been ceded, or surrendered to the government.

What could this case mean for Wahnapiitae First Nation ? For treaty First Nations, while the Robinson Huron treaty ceded lands for resource development in our area, the government will definitely have a higher obligation to consult, and where claims are outstanding (such as ours as we select lands in the land claim settlement) seek a level of community consent. Underlying this is the need for each Nation or territory to show use, occupation and affinity (show that we have and continue to be connected to our lands).

The stronger our documentation in this regard, the higher level of consultation, and even consent is required. Wahnapiitae First Nation has every opportunity now to build our data based on scientific and traditional knowledge of plants, animals, significant sites and archeological evidence to emphasize that both Ontario and Canada need to consult and even seek consent based on our proof of occupancy, use affinity throughout our territory. This can open new opportunities for our future generations.

The Supreme Court decision on June 26th is a major milestone to help bring the intent of our community to share in resource development. It has provided more guidance for what we need to undertake to become full partners and to fully share in resource development projects in the Wahnapiitae First Nation territory.

Land Use Plan

Wahnapi'tae First Nation will be working with Urban Systems Ltd., a planning and engineering consulting firm based out of British Columbia, to continue developing a land use plan for WFN. This will be integrated into the work that we are doing to develop land use planning goals and policies for the Treaty, watershed, and reserve levels.

The work with Urban Systems is being funded by the First Nations Market Housing Fund. The goal of the work is to develop policies for the use of land on the reserve while also developing policies for the protection of various areas of the reserve from development. This will help our community effectively plan for more members moving back to the reserve while also ensuring that there is land available for important services to be provided such as businesses and institutions which help support the community. The land use plan will have a map which will outline areas where houses should be built, where new commercial businesses could be located, where important services should be provided, and what areas of the reserve should be left in a natural state. In addition to the map, there will be policies which will provide guidance on how development should proceed and how areas should be protected. In essence, the land use plan will provide guidance on questions such as:

- What size of residential lots should we allow and what type of housing should be encouraged?
- What type of commercial development should be encouraged?
- What should new development look like?
- Where should key community uses, such as parks and infrastructure, be located?

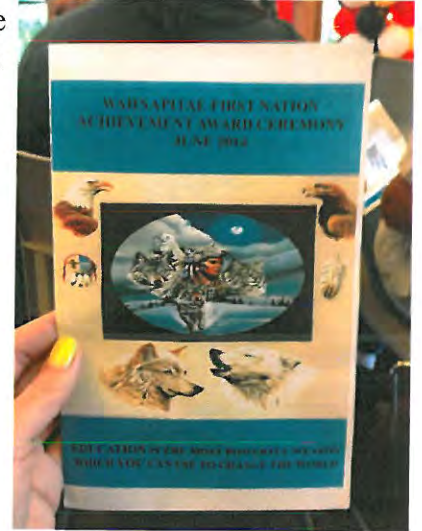

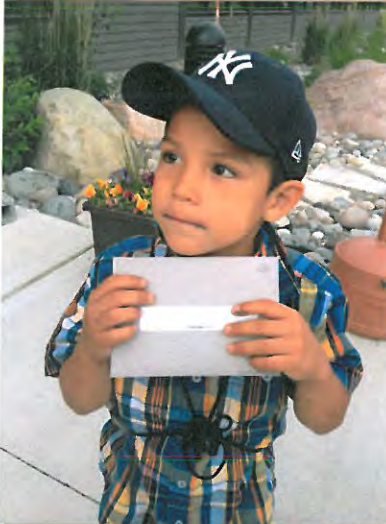
The student award ceremony was a great success; the smiles on the children's faces said it all.
